



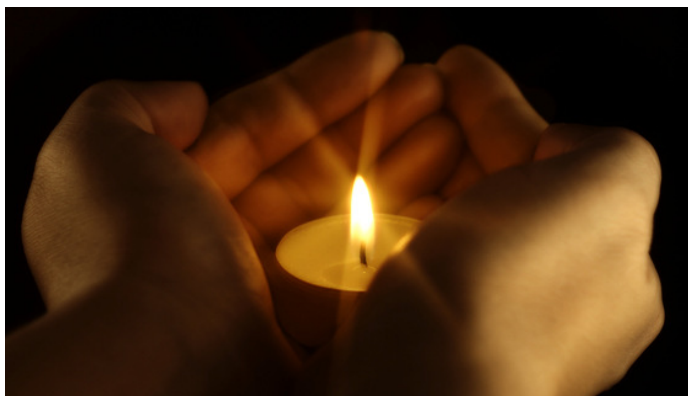

uninvited, the guest comes.

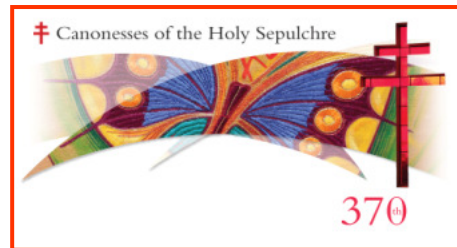
### ART EXHIBITION

## THE SITUATION IN THE DR CONGO

The situation in the Eastern Regions of the Congo has hit the headlines in England in recent weeks. The Rebel Army took control of Goma and has plans to advance to Bukavu. This has come with considerable bloodshed and displacements of people. It is the area where our Sisters live and we have been very concerned for their safety, especially the twenty Sisters who live in Goma. Please keep abreast of the situation and keep them all in your prayer.

O God, loving parent of all, comfort all those people who are being attacked, abused and displaced by this current conflict in the Congo; and give the people of that country courage to seek enduring peace with justice and freedom, that their children might grow up without fear.



## NEWS FROM RWANDA

In October S. Moira spent two weeks working with the new Priory in Rwanda, and with some Sisters from the DR Congo, who had to come to Rwanda for the meetings because it was not safe even at that time to cross the border into the Congo.



The newly established Literacy Centre at the Priory in Masaka is working well and has regular groups of people from the surrounding villages coming to learn basic skills of reading and writing. There are also lessons in dressmaking, which help women to earn small amounts of money.

## FUNDRAISING FOR THE NUTRITION CENTRE IN DR CONGO

The final leg of the Triathlon of Fundraising Events was a most enjoyable Quiz Night which raised just over £2,000.



This means that altogether we raised £7,000 which has gone directly to the Prioress of the DR Congo and has been used to start building the Nutrition Centre near Bukavu. In the present situation in that Country the need to feed orphans and displaced people is ever more acute.

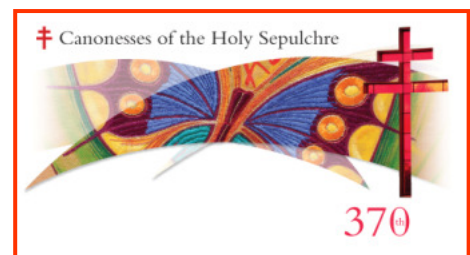
