


We stand before you, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.



























'Prophecy: Articulating the Reality'


Main Objectives of the Synod

- Recognize and appreciate THE WEALTH AND VARIETY OF GIFTS AND CHARISMS
- Explore PARTICIPATORY WAYS OF EXERCISING RESPONSIBILITY, exploring how responsibility and power are lived in the Church (converting prejudices and distorted practices)
- Accrediting the Christian community as a CREDIBLE SUBJECT AND RELIABLE PARTNER in paths of social dialogue, inclusion and participation, regenerating relationships

Acknowledge the reality of the people's situations





PARTICIPATORY WAYS OF EXERCISING RESPONSIBILITY



THE CHURCH: 'The whole Church is called to deal with the weight of a culture imbued with clericalism that she inherits from her history, and with those forms of exercising authority on which the different types of abuse are grafted' *Synod Preparatory Document*

- It is impossible to think of a 'conversion of our activity as a Church that does not include the active participation of all the members of God's People' (Pope Francis, *Letter to the People of God*, 2018)
- 'Religious fundamentalism... feeds forms of intolerance and violence that are
 also reflected in the Christian community and in its relations with society... It is
 equally necessary to consider the reverberation, within the Church and in its
 relations with society, of the fractures caused by reasons of ethnicity, race, caste
 or other forms of social stratification or cultural and structural violence'.
- 'The ability to imagine a different future for the Church and her institutions ... depends largely on the decision to initiate processes of listening, dialogue and community discernment... we need to let ourselves be educated by the Spirit to a true synodal mentality, entering with courage and freedom of heart into a conversion process...' Synod Preparatory Document

How is this 'journeying together' happening today in our particular Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our 'journeying together'?

- What experiences in our particular Church does this question calls to mind
- What joys or difficulties/obstacles did these experiences provoke? What wounds have they brought to light? What insights have emerged?
- Gather the fruits: where does the voice of the Spirit resound? What is being asked of us? What are the points to be confirmed, prospects for change, steps to be taken? What paths are opening up for us?
