THE BIG QUESTIONS

Our series of talks and discussions on today's challenging ethical and moral questions has continued with a session looking at the principles and practicalities of legitimate protest.

WHAT ARE THE LIMITS OF PROTEST AND DIRECT ACTION AS A LEGITIMATE EXPRESSION OF CHRISTIAN FAITH?

On Wednesday 31st January we welcomed Melanie Nazareth, of Christian Climate Action who led a conversation about protest and direct action as a legitimate expression of Christian Faith. We heard personal stories of people who have lived experience of taking part in public disruption. Although within the framework of climate action, the question had direct relevance to any context where people take a stand for what they believe.

CELEBRATING THE COMMUNITY ARRIVAL AT NEW HALL IN 1799 AND THE FIRST MASS ON FEBRUARY 3RD OF THAT YEAR

The Community was delighted to be able to attend a special celebration at New Hall on February 3rd to mark the 225th year since the first Community Mass was celebrated at New Hall in 1799 - not in the chapel which hadn't yet been refurbished - but in one of the large upstairs rooms above the retro choir which some Old Fishes may remember as a room for secretarial studies.

This anniversary Mass began in that upstairs room with a moment of remembering that day 225 years ago and then continued in the chapel itself which was full of Old Fishes: parents of Old Fishes, old friends, parents, parishioners and current school members. The service was very moving and the music excellent, reminding us of so many of the school and Community 'old favourites' - Tell out my Soul; Make me an Instrument of your Peace; All are Welcome.

A very happy celebration tea followed, during which we once more congratulated S.M. Magdalene on her Platinum Jubilee!
