SPIRITUALITY DAYS IN RWANDA

We were pleased to be able to participate both 'in the real' and virtually in the Conference held in Kigali run by our Association of Canonesses of the Holy Sepulchre and Daughters of the Resurrection.

The theme of the days was:

SYNODALITY: MOVING FORWARD TOGETHER IN OUR CONCERN FOR THE WORLD

We were led in our reflections by a Congolese Pallottine Father - Benjamin - who is both knowledgeable and experienced in promoting the Synodal vision and experience of Being Church.





This was the first such Conference held in Rwanda, led by African sisters with European sisters and Lay people being participants rather than leaders!!

The talks were interspersed with powerful liturgies and social evenings which cemented the bonds between us across the continents.

There were some interesting conversations around the theme of ecological conversion with rich exchanges from countries of such contrasting resources.

You may be interested in the '13 commandments' for true cooperation proposed by Joseph Böckenhoff, which featured as a tool on the Synodal Pathway.

- 1) Plan and dream with your partner. Don't have ready-made plans. The other has good ideas.
- 2) Encourage co-responsibility. Don't meddle in other people's affairs, but help them with their tasks.
- 3) Clearly define everyone's tasks. Don't think you have to do everything, but respect the principle of subsidiarity.
- 4) Inform as much as possible. Don't scorn other people's "stupid" questions, but be curious.
- 5) Give the other person credit for trust. Don't believe suspicious words, but give feedback.
- 6) Be authentic. Don't try to manipulate others, but be open to reality.
- 7) Accept differences. Don't see them as obstacles, but as complementarity and richness.
- 8) Look more at people than at structures. Don't look for uniformity, but unity.
- 9) Have the patience to arrive at a common conviction. Don't make false compromises; don't compete, but patiently create new solutions.
- 10) Be realistic. Don't expect perfection from yourself or the other person, but concentrate your efforts on the best you can.
- 11) Act like a mature person. Don't overestimate independence or dependence.
- 12) Stay calm. Don't put yourself or others under stress or fear, but rejoice in freedom and serenity.
- 13) Don't run after the faults of others, but create positive experiences and live from them.
